Fabric Bookmark

Materials needed: Canvas or heavy fabric

Cardboard

Ultahold Heatnbond Yarn or heavy string

Special Tools needed: Pinking shears

Single Hole Punch

Cutting the Pieces

Cut the pieces in the sizes indicated

Qty	Size
1	1-1/2" x 5-1/2" 2-1/2" X 6-1/2"
2	2-3/4" x 6-3/4"
	1 2

Preparing the Fabric

Preheat a dry iron to the silk setting.

Lay one of the fabrics face down on the ironing board. Lay one of the HeatnBonds, paper side up, on top of the fabric. See Figure 1. Press the fabric and heatnbond. A brief pressing of two or three seconds with the iron is all that is required to cause the heatnbond to adhere to the fabric. Peel off the HeatnBond paper backing.

Follow the same procedure with the other fabric and heatnbond.

Ironing the Pieces

Lay one of the fabrics, with the heatnbond up, onto the ironing board. Center the card board on top of the fabric. Lay the other fabric, with the heatnbond down, on top. See figure 2.

Glide the iron across all the pieces together. Flip the bookmark over and iron again.

Cutting the Edge

Cut all four edges of your bookmark with a pair of pinking shears. Do not cut the cardboard, but just the fabric as shown in Figure 3.

Use a hole punch to make a hole at the top. See Figure 3.

Adding the Tie

Tie a piece of yarn or heavy string (about 9" long) to the bookmark as shown in Figure 4.

Your are ready to keep place in your favorite book!








