

## Yo-Yo Garland

### For this projects you will need:

Scrap Christmas fabric  
Fiber stuffing or scrap quilt batting  
Needle and quilting thread

Skein Embroidery thread  
Two 2 hole buttons

### Making a Yo-Yo

Make a 1-1/4" (cut fabric into a 3" circle, about the size of a can of canned vegetables) yo-yo with Christmas fabric. Before completely gathering up the fabric, leave enough of an opening to stuff a little fiber stuffing inside. After stuffing the yo-yo, gather up the fabric and tie off as you do with a normal yo-yo. The yo-yo should be about 1/2" thick when pressed firmly between your first finger and thumb.

You will need about 24 stuffed yo-yos for each foot of garland.

### Connecting the Yo-Yo's

String the yo-yo's together with the embroidery thread.

### Making the Ends

At the end of the garland, split the embroidery thread into 2 strands of 3 threads each. Run each strand through a hole in a button. Bring the strands together and tie a knot as shown in Figure 1. Do the same on the other end of the garland.

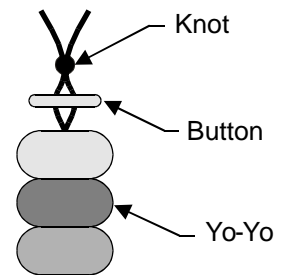
